Positive Tickets Net Positive Results

Nearly a year after its inception, the Positive Ticket campaign is being considered a success by local law enforcement agencies.

Parkland County Patrol joined forces with the RCMP at the Spruce Grove/Stony Plain detachment, Stony Plain Enforcement and Spruce Grove Enforcement in encouraging local residents to behave responsibly by recognizing their efforts.

"The idea is to catch people doing the right thing," said Parkland County Patrol Services Supervisor Pete Morris. "Positive Tickets would not be possible without the generous support of community minded businesses."

Those individuals caught doing things properly by a member of the participating law enforcement agency receives a Positive Ticket, which includes a coupon from one of several local businesses including Stony Plain Co-op, McDonald's Restaurants, Apple Drugs, A&W Restaurant, Boston Pizza and the Edmonton Eskimos.

Tickets have been issued to youths and adults alike for such things as assisting patrol officers, operating ATVs lawfully and safely, using restraints properly in vehicles and to pedestrians what were wearing reflective clothing.

"We are reminding people the importance of doing things safely and within the law, and when people are doing that, we are rewarding them with a Positive Ticket," said Morris.
