Are you highly motivated and enjoy working in a continuous learning, team environment? If so, consider joining our Community & Protective Services Department as a Community Peace Officer. Reporting to the Supervisor, Patrol Services, you will have an excellent opportunity to demonstrate your law enforcement skills and provide effective patrol coverage and enforcement of Provincial Statutes and County Bylaws. You will investigate complaints received from the general public, issue permits, conduct regular patrols, enhance public education and awareness, assist with emergency services, carry out court related duties and work closely with the RCMP. You possess excellent judgment, interpersonal and public relation skills in promoting positive customer relations on behalf of the County.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- Grade 12 Diploma supplemented by a two year diploma in law enforcement, criminal justice or a related field. Equivalent combinations of education, training and experience may be considered.
- Completion of the Alberta Solicitor General's Public Security Peace Officer Training within the last 5 years.
- Self-defense (PPCT), ASP baton, OC spray training within the last three (3) years.

- Must be willing to work shift work, weekends and statutory holidays.
