Fire Prevention Week

October 8 – 14 is National Fire Prevention Week™ and this year's campaign, "Cooking safety starts with YOU. Pay attention to fire prevention™," works to educate everyone about simple but important actions they can take to keep themselves and those around them safe when cooking. Here are a few reminders:

- Never leave your cooking unattended.
- Keep stove and burners clean.
- Turn pot handles toward the back of stove.
- Keep your outdoor grill in an open space, away from anything that could catch fire.







Staying Prepared!

Along with fire prevention, fire preparedness is also important. In Parkland County, we've seen firsthand how crucial it is to be ready for emergencies. You can stay prepared by:

- Creating a list of essential items for a quick grab and go.
- Having an emergency plan so you know where to go.
- · Packing an emergency kit for your vehicle.
- Keeping fuel tanks more than half-full (if you don't have a vehicle, have a plan in place).
- Calling your insurance provider to learn if your policy offers emergency financial assistance, or short-term housing.



Business Revitalization Program

Is your business in need of some upgrades? Now is the time to do it! Our Business Revitalization program is designed to increase the visual look of business storefronts throughout Parkland County. The program will enable businesses to revitalize their properties by completing meaningful improvements.

Business owners can apply to receive matching funding of up to 50% of the total cost of the suggested project to a maximum of \$2,500. Suggested

projects must enhance the business's premises and contribute to the community and landscape beautification.




Land Use Bylaw ReDesign

Municipal Bylaw Review

This review includes updates to existing bylaws and the development of one new bylaw to maintain the health, safety and welfare of the community.

Bylaws being reviewed are Animal Control, Cats (new), Community Standards, Fire, Off-Highway Vehicles, Parks, Traffic Control & Regulation and Unauthorized Use of County Land.

The bylaws are undergoing a legal review. Proposed changes will be updated based on information received from public engagement sessions and the legal review. These proposed changes will be shared for public review before being presented to Council.


Agricultural Bursaries
